PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." So writes the author of Ecclesiastes in chapter three. I hope to see you all of the time. I hope to work shoulder to shoulder with you as we press forward with the many items included in the mission of the church. Evangelism, choir, Sunday School, social welfare, Bible study, youth group, and so many more opportunities abound here at Cheshire Lutheran Church; indeed there is a season for everything here at CLC.

Our choirs will "tune-up" with their musical offerings in our worship; voices welcome!

While our congregational activities are somewhat abbreviated during the summertime, our worship, fellowship and ministries don't take a vacation. On the subject of evangelism, CLC will once again have a booth at the Cheshire Fall Festival on Saturday, September 12th. If you plan to attend the Fall Festival, please make a point to stop by the booth and show your support. While we, as a congregation, reach out to the community - offering worship, education, fellowship and ministries beyond our walls - your personal invitation to someone to either simply visit CLC, or consider joining our CLC family, is a powerful message.

As stewards of the affairs of the congregation, our Church Council will meet on Thursday, September 3rd at 7:00pm and our next Voters' Assembly meeting will be on Monday September 14th at 7:00pm.


Junior High Youth Group (High Impact):




PB&J Service Events

It is easy to participate! All that you need to do to be included is sign up! How do I sign up? You might wonder. Well, there are three ways to sign up for a photo shoot.


- † Schedule an appointment on line at the link which can be found on our website in the very near future – cheshirelutheran.org

COLUMBARIUM PROJECT UPDATE!...

The Committee has been quite busy over the Summer collecting information on what a Columbarium might look like at CLC, what the costs would be to construct it, how it could be financed, and under what By Laws it would be operated. We are in the process of putting all of this information into a format to present to the Church Council and Voters Assembly at their respective September meetings, and hope to secure approval to present to the entire congregation in October.



We have had a Landscape Architect prepare a schematic of a Columbarium site, (at no cost to CLC), and using this plan and speaking with several contractors who are familiar with these construction items, we have prepared a cost estimate for this facility. We have also met with a local funeral home director and discussed this project, and also received financial data regarding the interment of cremains at local cemeteries and columbariums.

Using the data from the Columbarium survey, we have contacted members who expressed an interest in a niche, and verified that they are still interested in purchasing a niche if it were built. We have also received information on other means of financial support – independent of any CLC financing. Although not contacted at this time, there were a number of CLC members that during the Columbarium survey expressed an interest in purchasing memorial plaques for family members.

Lastly, we have prepared a preliminary draft of By Laws – thanks to Priscilla Mulvaney- that would govern operation of the Columbarium if it were constructed. There was a lot to cover in these by laws – from the size of the niche, to how funds are managed, who oversees operation of the facility, and a host of other critical issues. The details included in this document clearly indicate this is a well thought out project.

In summary, we are excited to share this information with the Council, Voters, and entire congregation, and hope to do so over the next two months! It is clear that the Committee as a whole hopes that CLC will adopt this as a *mission* of our church, thereby filling a critical need for CLC members past, current, and future.

Key Verse: Deuteronomy 6:5-6


September 27: God Gives the Ten Commandments (Part 2)

Bible Point: God tells us how to respect others.






THURSDAY MORNING ADULT BIBLE STUDY GROUP...

So from now on we'll be known simply as the Thursday morning Study Group.

And on September 10th we'll begin reading together the historic document that defines who we Lutherans are, especially as we're differentiated from Christians of other denominations. The document, entitled the Augsburg Confession, dates from June 25, 1530; and it accounts for the fact that Lutherans worldwide are often referred to as "The Church of the Augsburg Confession". As in the past, our Study Group will be coming together for an hour every Thursday beginning at 8:30AM, except for the third Thursday of each month. If your schedule permits, you're cordially invited to be with us.




