PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing!" Isaiah 43:18 Every year begins with our Annual Corporate (ESV)

A blessed Christmas to you! Though I do not know whether this issue of the Heavenly Herald will be reaching you on Dec. 30 or Jan. 6, both are within the Christmas Season, so I am not late in my holiday greeting. (For those of you who do not know, or do not remember, the season of Christmas runs from sundown on the Eve of December 24 through January 6, the Feast of the Epiphany when we celebrate the visit of the Wise Men to the Holy Family. The old song that continually refers to a partridge in a pear tree got the number of days right, 12.) I pray your gatherings with family and friends have been, or will be, happy ones.

Please allow me to also share this wish with you: Happy New Year! As we close the calendar on 2018 and head into 2019, I look Q ÂI forward to all that the year ahead will bring, and all that our gracious Heavenly Father will do in and through Cheshire Lutheran. This is an exciting time of year, when we think about all the potential of the new year. It's a time to make a fresh start, do something new, and to leave behind the things of the past year that did not go well for us. That is also the thought behind all the "New Family engagement/participation; 5. Restart Year's Resolutions" that people make.

We've all made them at one time or another. We've determined that, in the New Year we will: eat right and exercise; spend less and save more; get the house in order and keep it that way; work less and take more time for family and friends; change careers and get that job we've always wanted; find love and start a family; or whatever it may be. 




NEED TO GET INFORMATION TO CERTAIN MEMBERS OF OUR CONGREGATION?



CLC's RICH HISTORY—THE CHRISMON TREE...

Advent and Christmas are past. The tree and decorations will be removed as we head into 2019.

This year's beautiful 22 foot tree came from Leavenworth Farm on Coleman Road. The tree was loaded on Ed Schweizer's trailer and brought to the church. A number of years ago the trees came from Durham, CT and was transported to CLC on a flatbed truck belonging to Roger Strollo. What a sight following the truck and tree over the back roads to Cheshire.

Most of the Chrismons are at least 35 to 48 years old and are carefully sorted, individually wrapped and stored. Each Chrismon has a special meaning. A picture of Gerry Mitlehner and our first decorated tree is in our historical scrapbook located in the library. Twenty women started making the Chrismons in October, 1970. A picture of El Smith, Dot Manke, Dot Roth, Gerry Mitlehner, and Judy Juul making some of the Chrismons is also present. A description of the ornaments is also in the scrapbook. A pictorial pamphlet of the ornaments was written a few years ago. Dave Schrumm has followed his father's practice of climbing the ladder and placing the

crown and selected ornament on the top of the tree.

The wreaths have a history too. Boy Scout troop 91, organized in 1960, sold thousands of wreaths going door to door to support camping and those attending High Adventure Camp. Bruce Turkelson, George Carson, Al Mitlehner, Al Manke, and Curt Smith were all involved with the troop. The current wreaths are obtained from troop 198. Guy Mason and his sons are current members of 198.

Bill and Debbie Sherman have supplied the white poinsettias at the base of the tree. Priscilla Mulvaney made the tree skirt. The poinsettias on the church altar are gifts of Johnathan Manke of Tower Farms. With many hands, it all comes together.

The spring saw our annual inside and outside clean up for Easter, a big thank you to everyone that helped. Bill Juul picked up some new wireless mic's, so our active pastor can deliver his sermon from anywhere in the church now The dishwasher washer in the kitchen was fixed and Don Drust was kind enough to replace the lights in the kitchen and fellowship hall with new bright LED lights – thank you Don!

In July we purchased a podium for the lesson readers and after only a few weeks the compliments and comments were clear and made me wonder why it took so long. We also purchased a chair caddy for the folding chairs in the library.

The unusual weather this year really taxed our air conditioning at the church and between May and September we had 4 service calls resulting in over a thousand dollars in unexpected repair bills. We will be keeping an eye on it again this year. The spring storms also brought down tree limbs and branches, but we were lucky to avoid any real damage. Thank you to those that cleaned up the parsonage and church grounds.

This fall we had our annual Fire inspection and changed to a local company here in Cheshire that also saved us some money. We also began looking for new lighting for the sanctuary to brighten up the church. After receiving bids from three vendors we decided to go with Don Drust's vendor due to price and availability. With the new lighting we will also be getting new fans for the ceiling and new electric outlets for our holiday decorations. All in all, a much-needed update to our sanctuary.

December saw our annual nativity scene set up (thanks again to Joe Stark for the new shed) and Christmas tree set-up and decorating. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped get our big beautiful tree up and decorated!

Lastly, we took good care of Little Cherubs throughout the year. 














SO, HOW ARE YOU GOING TO HELP?...
