

#### Pastor's Message

[God] has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." So we can confidently say, "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear." (Hebrews 13:5b-6a ESV)

It is hard to believe that Summer is almost upon us; it does not feel like it has been a full season since the snows of winter finally ceased. Still, there is no denying it. Memorial Day has come and gone, we have already had our first days where the temperatures entered the 80's, and, by the time you are reading this, children and teachers are counting the number of school days left using single digits.

The Summer brings many changes to people's lives and schedules, and that is just as true for our congregation as it is for our members. June 16 will be the last Sunday with two services for this school year; the following Sunday, June 23, will be our first of the Summer schedule for this year – just one service at 9:00 a.m. with time for fellowship outside after, but no Sunday School or Bible Study. In addition to Sunday classes being cancelled, Summer is also the time when the weekday Bible classes go on hiatus.

In the face of all these changes, one of our "more experienced" members said to me, "When you find out where God's gonna be this Summer, let me know. I'd like to spend some time with Him." Those words, though spoken in a somewhat winsome way, caught me pew or sitting in a golf cart. God is always off guard and really made me stop and think. Summertime is typically when people will try to take some time and relax; for those of us whose lives are affected by the school year, it is the time This is also just as true and certain when your when the pace slows and we try to get away. We go on vacation.

All too often, when we get away from our jobs and our homes on vacation, we also get away from our Lord. Though some people will still attend Church or read their Bibles when they are on vacation, many do not. In my life, I have

listened to many people talk about all the things that they packed to go on vacation, and I do not remember, even once, hearing someone include their Bible on that list (and I know I've never heard someone mention their hymnal). Even pastors have been known to be lax in this regard from time to time.

Between the changes we make to our schedule of services and classes at Church, and the changes we make to our own personal routines during the Summer, it almost begs the question: "Where is God over the Summer? Does He take a vacation too? We go away in the Summer; does He also go away?" Now, I know this may seem a little foolish, but, the way we behave in the Summer and change our schedules, one who did not know better might just wonder those things.

Yet, even though we might take a vacation and go away, God never goes away. He promises as much to you and me ythrough the apostle writing to the Hebrews; He says, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." God is always with you. He does not - will not - leave you. It doesn't matter if you are in Church on Sunday morning, or if you are in the middle of a thousand-mile trip. It makes no difference if you are sitting in a with you, wherever you go, to help you and to strengthen you. He will never leave you.

life is difficult and you're facing hardship or pain or loss. God does not leave you if you lose your job and cannot give an offering. He does not leave you if you are struggling with serious illness and forget to say your prayers. He does not leave you even if you are so distraught over the death of a loved one that you

#### NEWS FROM THE HOUSE & GROUNDS DEACON...


It has been a busy first half of the year for house and grounds, and I thought I would give you a quick summary of what we have done and what we have planned going forward. In February, we continued our replacement of the fluorescent lights with LED, this time in the library. In April, we had our annual cleaning of both the inside and outside of the church; thank you to everyone that helped, especially on a rainy outside-cleanup Saturday. New up-lighting was installed in the sanctuary (a special thanks to Don Drust who took the lead to get this done), along with new ceiling fans. We also repaired and repainted the classrooms and replaced the chalkboards with magnetic white boards (a big thanks to Ed Schweitzer, Dave Schrumm and Jim Mertz). Bill Juul worked tirelessly on our sound system in the sanctuary to reduce feedback and improve the sound quality. There was electrical work done for the heating system, emergency lighting and the classrooms plugs. A new first aid kit was purchased and is located on top of the AED (defibrillator) next to the library.




In May, I did a walk through of the church with Pastor, Ed Sweitzer, Dave Schrumm and Pat DiDomizio and we came up with a list of projects, some of which I look to complete this year like:

- Door sweeps in Little Cherubs and main doors to sanctuary
- Clean curtains in back of church
- Repair recessed lights in Little Cherubs
- Refinish stairs to choir loft
- Replace flashing on front of church
- 4 Add new shelf under TV in fellowship hall
- Purchase new projector
- Add new rocks in back of church

These are just some of the projects I'm looking to get done at the church this year. At the parsonage, we need to clear out some tree branches that came down over the winter. I also want to work with Pastor to see what we can do with the fireplace in his family room. The flue liner needs to be replaced before he can have a wood fire and we can either replace the liner or install a wood burning stove. I will talk with Pastor to determine the best option.



We appreciate your thoughtful participation in making this benevolence so successful.


