Pastor's Message

"25 For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. ²⁶ And after my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God, 27 whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold, and not another." (Job 19:25–27 ESV)

I pray you and your family are all doing well as you read this month's Heavenly Herald, and I hope to see you in Church starting on Palm Sunday. Unfortunately, the reality is that neither of those two is guaranteed to be the case. Right now, you may be having a hard time with being stuck at home because much of our state has closed down following the Governor's executive orders aimed at slowing the spread of COVID-

19. Those same executive orders have made Church's original plan to resume services on April 5 feel more like wishful thinking. I earnestly want you and your family to be well and I am anxious for the day we can all be back in Church, but those are my desires - not facts.

It's very easy for us to confuse our wants, desires, and expectations with facts – so easy that it happens more often than we realize. Teenagers take for granted they'll get a car of their own to drive after they have their driver's license, and then are disappointed to learn their parents have other plans. Men buy engagement rings for their future brides, only to hear the word "no" when they pull out the ring. Employees spend the bonuses they know they receive every year, but then have Because Jesus IS alive, your sins ARE forgivto scramble to pay the bills after company profits are down and the bonus does not come. Just because we want it, say it, hope it, or expect it does not make it a fact.

One thing that is a fact is the resurrection. Jesus Christ, the Son of God and the Son of Mary, who died on the cross on Good Friday and was laid in the tomb IS alive. He rose from the dead on Easter Sunday and now lives and reigns for

all eternity – that is a statement of FACT. It's a fact attested to by the witness of the women at the tomb, who saw the grave empty and heard the testimony of the angel. It's a fact shared by Mary, who saw Jesus with her own eves there in the garden. It's a fact confessed by Thomas, who touched the marks of the nails in Jesus' hands and the wound from the spear in His side. It's a fact shared by the Apostles, who saw him eat food by the seashore after His crucifixion and before they saw Him rise bodily into heaven. It's a fact confirmed by Paul, who persecuted the Church until Jesus appeared before him on the road to Damascus. It's a fact so true that

11 of the 12 Apostles were put to death because they would not deny it.

Jesus lives. The Lamb who was

slain is alive, never to die again. This fact is so sure and so certain that God's people knew it was true even before it happened. King David wrote of it in Psalm 22, almost one thousand years before Jesus was born. Isaiah the prophet recorded it in his "Servant Songs," roughly seven hundred years before the night the angels appeared to the shepherds. Job confessed it when oppressed and suffering, some two thousand years before Christ. Each of them knew it was true, knew it was certain, knew it was a fact even before it happened.

en. Everlasting life in heaven with God and all the rest of the faithful IS yours. Christ IS with you today, tomorrow, and every day – whatever challenges, difficulties, or hardships you might face. Jesus WILL strengthen you by His Holy Spirit and bring you through everything you face in life. Today, tomorrow, and every day your redeemer LIVES, and He gives His victory over sin, death, and

NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT

AND THE CHURCH COUNCIL

Greetings All,



Our second Council meeting of 2020 was conducted on Monday, March 9th and we had a very productive meeting! A few highlights are as follows:

The Council elected Craig Wilson to the open Education Deacon role. Judy DiDomizio provided her last interim update and a transfer of knowledge is underway for Craig to begin immediately. With Craig in attendance, we welcomed him to his new role and thanked Judy for her time, talents and dedication as Education Deacon during her three year plus two month term.

Amongst other normal business activities, the evolving Covid-19 health situation was top of mind for all of us. Pastor began sharing with us an action plan developed by the Wellness and Safety committee and driven by government and CDC guidelines for how best to reduce the spread of germs, starting with alternatives to sharing of peace through details such as delivery of communion and sanitization.

We also began considering options for Sunday Services, which led to preparing for our first live streaming Service on Sunday morning 3/22 at 8 a.m. via our CLC YouTube channel accessible via our website. We received positive feedback from many of you on the experience and will continue to refine the process and content where feasible and technically possible. Thanks to countless hours of testing by Pastor and Bill Juul focused on sound, technology and lighting.

In partnership with Stewardship Deacon Rob Delaubell, we are diligently researching online giving options and hope to have a secure and easy to use solution in place soon. In the interim while onsite services are cancelled, we ask that you keep our Mission plan for 2020 in mind and continue tithing via the mail, so we can deliver on our local and global commitments to do God's work.

With the health situation fluid at this time, we're unable to predict how long we'll be living our lives while adhering to social distancing practices to keep our families and loved ones safe. For now, while our onsite events are temporarily cancelled, please know our office is still open, Council is here to support you, and we are still operating using remote methods. Do not hesitate to contact Pastor, the office, any Council member or myself if a need arises – best contact info for me is below.

Keep checking your email or our church website for continued updates as we navigate these stressful and trying times. If you're not getting our mass distribution emails, call the church office to make sure we have your current email address on file or you can email office@cheshirelutheran.org

God willing, our next Voters meeting is Sunday, May 3rd after the 10:30 a.m. service. God bless and see you virtually in church!


I look forward to worshipping with you on Easter Sunday as we celebrate again the fact that our Redeemer lives.




After making your selection, please leave your money or check in the box attached to the display.





SCRAP BOOK & LIBRARY PROJECT NEWS...







For a typical four Sunday month, there can be at least 70 "periods of service" when members usher, acolyte, read lessons, greet other members before service, and prepare the altar. (And this does not count the choir's musical offerings that make our worship special).






NEWS FROM OUR LITTLE CHERUBS...

HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE NEWS...

How to Wash Your Hands

It's one of the most important things you can do to protect yourself, your family and your community. And if you're like us, you've probably been doing it wrong.

Will touching the wet faucet really ruin everything?

Yes. The faucet may have the same germs you started with! Use a tissue or paper towel to turn it off once your hands are clean. You don't want to begin again, do you?

How hard do I have to scrub?

Most people don't rub vigorously enough, said Barbara Smith, a nurse epidemiologist and infection prevention specialist at Mount Sinai Health Systems in New York. When you wash your hands, you are using soap and water to physically dislodge germs from your skin and then rinse them away.

Do I really have to dry my hands all the way?

Most people don't dry thoroughly enough. Germs love moisture. And don't be afraid to use a little force here too: You are physically removing whatever germs remain.

Do I have to use paper towels?

No. Cloth towels are fine for personal use, but should be washed every few days — more if multiple people use the same towel. A sick person should use a separate towel. Use paper towels for guests!

What about an air dryer?

In terms of hygiene, <u>paper towels are best</u>. Hand dryers are OK, so long as you dry your hands thoroughly. There is inconclusive research that suggests a higher germ concentration around some hand dryers, but using a hand dryer is definitely better than wiping your hands on your pants.

What's the best way to know you've washed for 20 seconds?

One one-thousand, two one-thousand, three one-thousand...

Does it matter what kind of soap I use?

Liquid soap is best. Bar soap is fine too, just don't let it sit around in a gloppy dish. Remember: germs love moisture.

When should I be washing my hands?

- ♦ Before you leave the house (to protect others from your germs).
- And when you arrive at your destination (to wash off germs you've picked up from door knobs, elevator buttons, public transportation, etc.)
- ♦ Before and after you eat or prepare food.
- ♦ Before and after you clean your home.
- ♦ After you blow your nose, cough or sneeze.
- ♦ After you use the bathroom or change a diaper.
- ♦ After you feed or touch a pet.

What about lotion for dry hands?

Yes, but use your own personal supply (most lotion does not contain antibacterial agents, so it should not be shared). And don't forget to keep the bottle and dispenser clean!

Can I still paint my nails?

Yes, but it's best to keep your nails short and your manicure fresh. Germs can live in cracked and chipped polish.

What's the technique with hand sanitizer?

Use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol, and scrub your hands the same way you would with soap and water. Be sure to use enough liquid so you can reach every surface of your hands. *Note:* If you've seen the recipe circulating on social media for homemade sanitizer using aloe vera gel and rubbing alcohol, we tried it and it didn't work. You'll just wind up with a batch of diluted alcohol.

Is hand-washing really that important?

"Your hands carry almost all your germs to your respiratory tract. Keeping them as clean as possible is really helpful," said Dr. Adit Ginde, professor of emergency medicine at the University of Colorado School of Medicine. "It would dramatically reduce transmission if people did it well."
