"¹ Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD! ² O Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my pleas for mercy!" Psalm 130:1-2 (ESV)

Life can be difficult.... We'd like to think that it n will always be easy and that it will always be good, but that's not true. The poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow expressed that truth when he penned the line "Into each life some rain must fall" in his poem *The Rainy Day* and Ella Fitzgerald later sang a song using that same line as the title. Sooner or later, everyone faces adversity. In my own admittedly short life, I don't think I have ever met a single person who has had a life free of problems or difficulties. (If you are one of the rare few, please don't tell me – I'd be worried your good streak would end after informing me.)

The expectation for us Christians is that we will simply take these situations in stride – we'll pray about it, read some relevant Bible verses, entrust the matter to God, and then promptly move on. The reality is often far from that simple. Problems rarely go away quickly, doubt or anxiety often lingers, and sometimes God's answer to our prayers is "No." When problems persist and difficulties do not go away, we're tempted to think that God is not listening, that He does not care, or even that He has abandoned us. The Psalms are replete with the cries of God's people as they call out to Him in their need and desperation.

Even when nothing seems to be going right, the troubles have no end, and you think you are all alone, <u>God is still with you</u>. I know that it may not feel that way when you are facing setback after setback, but He <u>IS</u> with you. By water and the Word you were joined together with Christ Jesus in Holy Baptism, united with Him in death

and in life. God's promise to you is certain and sure; Christ Himself said, "Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt. 28:20) and the Apostle reminds us of the word God spoke to you and me, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." (Heb. 13:5).

Of course, it's easy to speak those promises in the abstract, to point to them when you are not going through the difficulty yourself, when the suffering is another person's. For the one enduring the hardship, actions often

speak louder than words. So, let's look at the actions: look at Christ's life, lived for you; look at Christ's passion, endured for you; look at Christ's death, suffered for you. Jesus's life, suffering, death, and resurrection were all for you. The God who loved you so much that He lived and died all for you, will certainly not abandon you now – no matter what you are facing.

Sometimes we forget all that Jesus endured for us; that's why we have the season of Lent. It's a time when we can fix "our eyes again on Jesus and see Him – really see Him – not just as the man who works miracles, but as the God who suffers all, even death and Hell itself, so that you will be with Him forever. Join me this Lenten season as we fix our eyes on Jesus, see His suffering and passion, and rejoice that God

loves you so much that He will give anything, even His own life, all for you.

In Christ Jesus, who went down to the depths of woe to lift you up to the joys of Heaven,
