FROM OUR DISTRICT PRESIDENT



Dear Sisters in Mission:

When my husband and I lived in Arizona, we found such beauty in the desert. We marveled at God's creation and a landscape so very different from the East Coast. We loved to visit Saguaro National Park and the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum, where we enjoyed learning all about the cacti that grew in the Sonoran Desert.

We found the saguaro cactus to be the most majestic and the most beautiful, especially when it flowered in the spring. The saguaro was magnificently designed by God to collect and store water. The saguaro has one root that extends deep into the ground to collect water. It also has an extensive shallow root system stretching out in all directions allowing it to easily collect rainfall. The stored water helps the saguaro survive the harsh desert climate.

The beauty of God's creation reminds us how we are *fearfully and wonderfully made* (Psalm 139:14). It also reminds us how God cares for all of His creation, including us. *Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow* nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toll nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these (Matthew 6:26, 28-29).

This also brings to mind the man described as blessed in Psalm 1. *His delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither* (Psalm 1:2-3). Just as water is necessary for all living things, so the Word of God is necessary for us to remain spiritually alive. We need to drink water every day, so, too, we need to be in the Word and in conversation with our Father daily.

As the saguaro stores water for the times of drought in the desert, so we meditate daily on God's Word, storing it up for the times of drought in our lives. We all face trials in this life, and the Holy Spirit strengthens us through the Word to face these trials with hope, peace, joy, and comfort.

The stored water not only helps the saguaro survive the times of drought, but it enables it to produce flowers and fruit. The fruit is a source of food for desert birds and animals. In the same way, when we are fed daily by the Word of God, it produces in us the fruit of good works, as we stay connected to Jesus, our Vine. *I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing* (John 15:5).

LWML is committed to encouraging you to be daily in the Word and provides resources to assist you. You can find a "Read Through the Bible in One Year" calendar for each month on the LWML website (lwml.org) under "Gospel Outreach Resources." You can also find Bible studies, devotions, and more under the "Word" tab on the website.

The LWML-NED is equally committed to encouraging you to be daily in the Word and invites you and your family and friends to join us for our annual retreat next month. At the retreat, we will study the book of Ephesians with the Rev. William Weedon. Rev. Weedon provides you with another opportunity to be daily in the Word. 10Sea Containers for Haiti Earthquake Response, Ministry in Mission,
Chesterland, OH\$5,000



Ministry in Mission has been working in Haiti for almost 15 years through all of the disasters such as the 2010 earthquake, hurricanes, COVID, political unrest, and general poverty. Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, and medical care for this desperate population is less than acceptable. The medical professionals in Haiti are few and not well trained, and medical supplies are lacking. A Ministry in Mission Board member is a physician and leads medical teams to Haiti. As the

mission teams travel from the US to Haiti supplies are carried in 50-pound suitcases, but they are unable to carry enough to last even a day. It has been reported by our medical missionaries that gauze is picked up off the emergency room floor and reused several times. A **sea container** full of medical supplies would go a long way toward containing infection and saving lives. Shipping containers to Haiti is very expensive with the cost ranging from \$10,000 to \$12,000.

About This Mission Grant

Orphan Grain Train (OGT) has carried out the mission of the Lord for thirty years by providing humanitarian service. They work through the church, so the Gospel always accompanies their service. They have assisted orphans, carried out domestic disaster relief, gathered, sorted, packed, and distributed food, clothing, medical supplies, equipment, and educational materials for those experiencing poverty in the U.S. and internationally.

The original facility in Norfolk, Nebraska, is outdated and lacking adequate space to carry out their expanding work. They need to build an additional facility to increase their mission capacity and increase the safety level for volunteers. With an increased work area, larger groups of volunteers can work on donations received and the output of mercy meals can double to 10,000,000 meals annually. This grant will help OGT complete their building project.
