A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR LOUIS NUECHTERLEIN

HOLY SPIRIT IS WITH YOU.

Pastor Rowold's front page article in the September issue of the HEAVENLY HERALD ("Return to the Lord your God"...Deuteronomy 30:2) struck me personally in a powerful way. If you're willing to read on, let me explain. Four vears ago, shortly after the birth of our greatgrandson Owen Lawrence Brod (son of Michael 271) – to read carefully, noting especially & Molly, who, in turn, are the son and daughterin-law of our daughter Mary and her husband Bob Brod), I casually mentioned to Michael (after congratulating him!) that I would be honored to officiate at Owen's baptism. "Oh, Grandpa," he answered politely. "I know my parents took me to church regularly and during my early teens oversaw my being confirmed in the faith; but I lost my faith later during my four student years at Northwestern University. We're not planning to have Owen baptized."

Struggling to hide my disappointment, I asked Michael if he'd be willing to let me continue to be in occasional pastoral touch with him as the months passed, and he agreed. In fact, one Saturday a year or so later, he even drove all the way to Cheshire from Roslindale, MA (where he and Molly live) to spend a Saturday evening with me, discussing whether Christianity is still valid and true in this 21st century.

The next morning, he left for home again with an answer still "up in the air" for himself – and with me continuing to pray – "Holy Spirit, work within Michael, as only You can, the will to believe that we humans (including his newborn son) are all sinful and in need of God's forgiveness, which He promises for Jesus' sake to daughter Anne, living in Tampa, FL, and provide for us, beginning with the "washing with happily married as of last April to a lovely water and the Word " (Holy Baptism). PLUS: Each time we talked (mostly by phone), I asked Michael to pray (even if he wasn't fully convinced) for the Holy Spirit to persuade him

NEVER GIVE UP - ESPECIALLY IF GOD'S that the Bible's teaching re: baptism was still true and effective and powerful.

> So things continued – until on October 31st of last year Michael and Molly became parents of a second son, Simon Richard, after which I sent them a printed copy of the Lutheran Rite of Holy Baptism (LUTHERAN SERVICE BOOK. pages 268-God's promise that baptism marks us as "redeemed by Christ the crucified" and our promise to believe it, as stated in the Apostles' Creed – and to bring up their two

sons within Christ's Church.

As I wrote above, I know Michael to be a serious, thoughtful person; so, I did nothing further – except to keep praying for God's Spirit to do His work of "persuading". And I'm so very glad that HE DID! On Friday, August 22nd, of this year, Michael phoned to say, "Grandpa, Molly and I are ready! Can we come to Cheshire on Saturday, August 31st (a weekend when his parents were also planning to be here in Cheshire) for you to baptize both Owen and Simon?" Tears of joy came to my eyes as I joyfully replied "YES! DO COME!"

And so, M & M and sons drove here to Elim Park – and under the auspices of CLC the two baptisms took place in our EP Sanctuary, with Yours Truly doing the honors! (See picture of all of us on our CLC bulletin board.)

P. S. The very next day, on Sunday, September 1st, it so happened that our grandson Ben Harney, age 27, son of our nurse named Alexis, phoned here to our EP apartment with, among other matters, the following message: "and Grandpa, I just





SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS...

This year in Sunday School we are encouraging kids to have a **brief** snack with their families at the start of Coffee Hour, because Sunday School will start promptly at 9:20 each Sunday. We will gather in the area across from the kitchen for opening and the Bible narrative and then go to classrooms for review of the lesson and activities.

When the students go to the classrooms, they will be divided into 4 groups: Toddler and Parent; Pre-K to Kindergarten; Grade 1-3; and Grades 4-6. Grades 7-12 will be with Mr. Andy Clark for Youth Bible Study. At 10:20, Sunday School will end and the students will rejoin their families.

We are using Enduring Faith materials from Concordia Publishing House for the lessons this year. Every lesson has a take home page with a brief summary, main point and an activity that can be done as a family to reinforce the lesson.

We will have a "Fun Sunday" this month on October 13, 2024. On this day, we will gather and stay together as a group the whole time; instead of a normal lesson, we will have Bible-based fun and learn a little about Joseph.

We will have Sunday School most Sundays during the School Year, but there will be a total of 4 Sundays off. This year, the Sundays off will be December 1 (Thanksgiving weekend), December 22 & 29 (Christmas break), and April 20 (Easter Sunday). The rest of the school year we will have Sunday School every Sunday, either a regular lesson or a "Fun Sunday" when the schools are closed the next day.

The Sunday School Bulletin Board outside the Church office will have information about the current week in Sunday School and the next, so you can know what the current and next lessons are at a quick glance.

Save the dates! We will have the Annual Christmas Program on December 8, 2024, during the 10:30 service. The Script will be sent home in October and rehearsals will begin on November 10, 2024, during the Sunday School hour.










WELLNESS & SAFETY COMMITTEE NEWS...



As technology continues to advance and expand, so do scammers, learning new methods to try to steal your money or your identity. This page includes information on common scams to be aware of and tips that can help keep you safe.





October is once again National Fire Prevention month. Even though we only talk about it during our Sunday morning announcements in October, it's still important for all of us to take some time and be prepared.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS AT HOME

1. Make sure you have working smoke alarms in your home – one for every level. Remember to check all of them every month and to change the batteries regularly. (Twice a year is a common recommendation, and the beginning and end of daylight savings time can be a helpful reminder.) For added safety you can get units that are both smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.

2. Avoid electrical fires by unplugging appliances when not in use (This can save on your electricity bill too.) and do not overload outlets by plugging in too many devices with things like power strips. When using an extension cord, make sure it is thicker than the cord for the device you are plugging in (to keep from overloading the extension cord) and do not put electrical wires under rugs or in high traffic areas.

- 3. Consider getting at least one fire extinguisher for your home. More fires start in the kitchen that in any other room, so this would be a good place to have one. Remember to get a fire extinguisher that is designed to work on common fires you might have in your home.
- 4. Clean the lint trap of your clothes dryer regularly, preferably after every drying cycle, and clear out any lint under or behind the dryer twice a year. Fires in residential areas often start in the clothes dryer.
- 5. Have an escape plan for how you will get out of your home if there is ever a fire. Make sure you know the route out of every room in your house and practice getting out. Practice staying low to the ground and checking doors with the back of your hand to see if it is hot. Don't forget to designate a place outside of the home and far enough away where everyone will gather to make sure they are safe.

IF THERE IS EVER A FIRE AT CHURCH

Make your way to the nearest exit and go outside; when you are outside head to one of two



meeting places. If you see the Church sign when you get outside, you are at the front of the building – head towards the sign and wait on the front lawn by it. If you see the large white cross, you are at the back or the side of the building – head towards the cross and wait on the back lawn by it. If you have limited mobility, ask for help and other members will assist you in getting as far from the building as possible.



Everyone is welcome to join us any time, even if it's your first time, and even if it will be the only time. I look forward to seeing you.




