PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Return to the Lord your God, you and your children, and obey His voice in all that I command you today, with all your heart and with all your soul." Deuteronomy 30:2 (ESV)

As August turns to September, the yearly cycle changes once again. Summer vacation with its family trips, slower pace, and times of rest and refreshment come to an end. In its place, a new academic year begins, with teachers and students alike going back to school. The focus on play and fun stops, and attention is turned, once again, to the tasks of learning and growth. In countless communities across our nation, people are returning to the normal routines, places, and activities that give structure to so much of our everyday lives.

Even in the Church, this is a time to return. Summer worship times are ending and houses of worship are going back to their "normal" schedules. Christian education programs are resuming, with Sunday school classes, Bible studies, and Youth programs. The pace of activities and events begins to pick up as people return to patterns of attendance and participation that mark the majority of the year.

It's not just the calendar of the School Year or the scheduling of events at Church that calls us to return, however. Almighty God is calling out to us today; He's beckoning to all those, near and far, with a message that is as simple as it is challenging. God's Word and His will for you and for me is clear, return!

In the waters of Holy Baptism, God the Father brought your near to Himself by the power of His Word, grafting you to the vine that is Christ Jesus. Since then, we have spent our lives pulling away from God. We do it physically when we willingly choose to be somewhere other than His house on Sunday morning, deciding that there is another location we would rather be than the place where His Word is proclaimed and His Sacraments are administered.

We pull away from God mentally when we let our minds wander during worship or prayer or study of the Scriptures, or when we intentionally set our thoughts on other things and neglect our relationship with Him. We pull away from God spiritually as we chase after our own personal wants and dreams and desires, instead of seeking His will for our lives; we forsake the true God who loves us, in order to pursue the false gods that spring from our own selfish desires and from the

fallen world in which we live.

And every time that we pull ourselves away from God, leaving Him behind to go in search of our own sinful ends, He calls out to you and me the message from Deuteronomy 30, Return! Return to the Lord your God. Whether you have been away physically this summer, or mentally, or spiritually, God invites you to return.

Return to His house, where God's love in Christ Jesus is given freely in His Word, shared during Sunday School and Bible study and the Divine Service. Return to His table, where forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are poured out on the faithful, as the very body and blood of Christ are put into your hand and into your mouth in Holy Communion. Return to His body, the Church, where your brothers and sisters in Christ stand ready to walk with you throughout this earthly life, sharing in your joys and your struggles, and offering you the comfort, strength, and consolation that God gives through His people.

There is nothing stopping you from answering the call, from responding to the invitation. Return to Him. In the very cross of Christ, God conquered forever all that



Apple Picking and Hayride will be held Sunday, September 29th. We will meet at Blue Hills Orchard at 1:00. The 1-hour hayride is first come, first served so when you arrive, be prepared to wait for all attendees so we can get on the same wagon. Following the hayride, you can pick apples at your own pace. A wagon will bring you to the fields and comes back around often to collect you and your delicious apples. The apples are \$2.25 per pound. There is not a tremendous amount of walking, no hills, and the apples are easy to reach. Now, we just need the weather to cooperate! Please join us for this family friendly day of fellowship!

CLC Potluck and Sourdough

I always look forward to the smell of Autumn. The air is crisp and cool and I am ready to bake! Oh wait. It is also a busy time of year; back to school activities are in full swing, including football, band, soccer, and piano lessons. There are committee meetings and reports to be done. Not to worry! Susan Harris has a quick and easy sourdough bread recipe that fits into your hectic schedule. The bread is a rustic loaf, crunchy on the outside and moist and tender on the inside. The best part is, it takes 5-10 minutes to prepare before letting it sit and rise and then finally bake.

Join us on Saturday, October 5th, 6 PM for a Potluck dinner followed by a very short lesson in creating this delicious sourdough bread. We will mix the 3 ingredients in the kitchen at CLC, take the dough home and bake it before or after church services Sunday morning. Bring a 12 cup plastic bowl with a tight fitting lid, rubber spatula or wooden spoon, 2 measuring cups (one for flour and one for liquid) and 1 and ½ measuring teaspoons. 



SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS...

Welcome Back! We have some exciting news about Sunday School this year.









We are encouraging kids to have a **brief** snack with their families at the start of Coffee Hour, because Sunday School will start at 9:20 **sharp** each Sunday. We will gather in the area across from the kitchen for our Opening, where we will take attendance, acknowledge birthdays, sing, pray, recite the Creed and the 10 Commandments, and listen to the Bible lesson for the day. Then at 9:50, we will split into classrooms for activities.

When the students go to the classrooms, they will be divided into 4 groups: Toddler and Parent; Pre-K to Kindergarten; Grade 1-3; and Grades 4-6. Grades 7-12 will be with Mr. Andy Clark for Youth Bible Study. At 10:20, Sunday School will end and the students will rejoin their families.

We will be using Enduring Faith materials from Concordia Publishing House for the lessons this year. Every lesson has a take home page with a brief summary, main point and an activity that can be done as a family to reinforce the lesson.

We are also going to try having "Fun Sundays" in Sunday School this year. These will take place on the Sundays when the public schools are closed on the following Monday. On "Fun Sundays," we will gather and stay together as a group the whole time; instead of a normal lesson on those days, we will have a variety of Bible-based fun. We might play a game, watch a video, or have some kind of group activity. Join us for "Fun Sundays" and see what happens.

We will have Sunday School most Sundays during the School Year, but there will be a total of 4 Sundays off. This year, the Sundays off will be December 1 (Thanksgiving weekend), December 22 & 29 (Christmas break), and April 20 (Easter Sunday). The rest of the school year we will have Sunday School every Sunday, either a regular lesson or a "Fun Sunday" when the schools are closed the next day.

The Sunday School Bulletin Board outside the Church office will have information about the current week in Sunday School and the next, so you can know what the current and next lessons are at a quick glance.

Save the dates! We will have the Annual Christmas Program on December 8, 2024, during the 10:30 service. The Script will be sent home in October and rehearsals will begin on November 10, 2024, during the Sunday School hour.

Every Sunday School family will receive a welcome letter and the name of the teacher in their child(ren)'s classroom(s). There will also be information about how we are handling the Sunday School offering this year. We want to teach Stewardship in a way that the kids can grasp and understand. We will be taking a slightly different approach to Sunday School offering envelopes this year and will say more about that in a letter to the parents as well.

We are still looking for a few more teachers to help this year; we would like to have a team of teachers for each class. The full list of Sunday School staff will be posted in the October Heavenly Herald. I know this is later than usual, but the list will not be complete in time for the September newsletter deadline.

Thank you all for your support and involvement in our Sunday School program.
