

Some of them are comparatively small and lack major News from The Social Welfare Deacon 11 | significance, like whether or not you will have dessert tonight after dinner or what you will wear tomorrow. Other choices can change the course of a person's life, $\frac{13}{14\cdot15}$ what job will they pursue when they enter the work force or whether they will get married. Those little decision that we make are typically easy, and making the wrong choice does not usually have earthshattering implications. When it comes to those major decisions, however, the $\frac{2}{20}$ consequences can be far reaching.

The Israelites faced one of those big decisions at the end of Joshua's life. Following the death of Moses, Joshua had Strengthening our Digital Presence on 21 led God's people into the Promised Land. After years of struggle, most of the land promised to the Patriarchs was finally possessed by God's people. They were finally starting to get settled and to make a life for themselves in this new land. Now that the hardest part was behind them and they serve? They could follow the gods commonly

were looking toward the future, the people had to make a choice: what God were they going to worshipped in the new land in which they were living, or the gods that Abraham and his ancestors had followed before the LORD chose him, or they could follow the God who had rescued them from slavery in Egypt and kept them alive for 40 years in the wilderness and given them the Promised land.

It was a big decision, but it was a pretty easy God was, what He had done for His people, and what He would continue doing to take care of them in the future. There was a the LORD God – and one that was clearly

This Fall, you are going to be faced with several choices. Some of them will be easy, while others will be difficult. 



Saint Paul exhorts us in Philippians 4, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Go to God in prayer and ask Him to help you know what to do.

The next thing you can do is read your Bible. Remember, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16–17). God's plan and purpose for you and me is laid out in His Holy Word. While you won't find a clearly laid out "voter's guide" in the Bible, you will see what is right and wrong in God's eyes, and what He expects from each of us. In Holy Scripture, He tells us everything we need to know.

And, of course, be an informed voter. Read up on the ballot questions that you may face. When it comes to the candidates, do your own research and look to see what each one is saying about themselves, what their positions are, and what policies they are advocating. Do not rely solely on what other people are saying about the candidates – especially if it comes from ads attacking a candidate or from their opponent. Right now, lots of folks are doing a very poor job of following the Eighth Commandment, and the *worst* construction seems to be put on everything.

In the end, make the best decision that you can. Vote according to your faith, vote according to your conscience, but remember to vote. You may not find a candidate that you totally agree with or a ballot question that you love, but you may well find a candidate you disagree with or a ballot question you cannot support.

Whatever the outcome may be of the choices that lay before us, God is still in control, as Proverbs reminds us, "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails" (19:21). Regardless of what happens, He has promised to always be with you. Remember, "It is the LORD who goes before you. He will be with you; He will not leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed." (Deut. 31:8) and Jesus said "Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt. 28:20).

Yes, life is full of choices. Some will be easy, and others will not. With God's help and guidance, make the best choices that you can. Then trust in Him to work out His plan.



 - * Contributions can be recurring or one time only
 - * The ability to create an account or make donations as a guest
 - * Little Cherubs Tuition payments can also be submitted through the Church's website. The payments can be made directly from a bank account without incurring any transaction fees. If paying by credit or debit card you must select to pay the 3% fee to offset the transaction fees






