A WORD ABOUT THE LESSONS

The Lord, Jesus Christ, Opens Our Eyes to God and Brings Us into His Presence As He did for blind Bartimaeus, so does the Lord, Jesus Christ, have mercy upon you. With His Word of the Gospel, "he is calling you" to Himself, to "take heart," to rise up and live by faith in His forgiveness. He opens your heart and mind to see and know God rightly in Him and to follow Him "on the way" of the cross and into life everlasting (Mark 10:49–52). "He is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him," because He is the great High Priest, who offered Himself "once for all" as a sacrifice for sins. Since He is risen from the dead and "exalted above the heavens," He "holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever," and "he always lives to make intercession" for His people (Heb. 7:24–27). Along with that, He gathers the children of God to Himself by the proclamation of His Gospel, even "from the farthest parts of the earth." In mercy He calls them, by the waters of Holy Baptism, "in a straight path in which they shall not stumble," unto life everlasting (Jer. 31:8–9).
