


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### IN MEMORIAM: Pastor Louis George Nuechterlein

With heavy hearts, we announce the passing of our beloved Pastor Louis George Nuechterlein on January 25, 2025. Born on October 10, 1928, in Saint Joseph, Michigan, Pastor N devoted his life to the service of God and His people. He dedicated his early years to teaching and music at East Bethlehem Lutheran Church before completing his theological studies at Concordia Theological Seminary in Saint Louis, Missouri.

In 1960, Pastor N accepted the call to Cheshire Lutheran Church (CLC) and was installed as our Pastor on June 19, 1960. For over three decades, he and his wife Gloria, along with their four children, made significant contributions to our community. Pastor N.'s leadership and dedication were instrumental in the growth and development of CLC, including the preparation and dedication of our church building, the Schlicker organ, and the Memorial Bell.



Pastor N officially retired in 1994 but remained an active and cherished member of our congregation. He was declared Pastor Emeritus in 1996 and continued to serve us faithfully with Gloria by his side.

We remember Pastor N for his unwavering faith, love for our church, and his profound impact on our community. His guiding words, "the congregants may do the work, but God makes it happen," continue to resonate within our hearts. Pastor N and Gloria's legacy lives on in our church, reflecting their dedication and love.

We extend our deepest gratitude to Pastor N and Gloria for their many years of service. As Pastor N often reminded us, "The Best is Yet to Come."

Cheshire Lutheran Church will forever cherish the memory of Pastor Louis George Nuechterlein, a devoted shepherd who led us with grace and love.

Pastor N's Funeral will be at Cheshire Lutheran on February 7 at 1 PM, with Calling Hours in the Church Library starting at 11:30 AM. After the Service, his cremains will be lovingly placed in the Columbarium & Memorial Garden at Cheshire Lutheran Church.

The following congregants now rest in our hearts and whose remains are a reminder to remain steadfast in hope and faith that we will be reunited.



### NEWS FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY...

As I begin my service as your Financial Secretary, I want to thank the following people for graciously helping me transition into this role:

- ✤ Alan and Carol Santoro, who have been (and continue to be) so patient and thorough in passing on their knowledge;
- ✤ Nancy Schweitzer, who has helped me to understand how the Treasurer's Office and the Financial Secretary work together to serve the Church;
- Bill Soulier, for his help with some of the Sunday money counts and for sharing his knowledge;
- Brenna Steczkowski, for her help in understanding how the Financial Secretary's reports flow into the Steward Keeper system that she maintains; and

the many CLC members who have welcomed me to the role and wished me well. Since tax season is upon us, here is some information that might help some of our members save some money on their federal and state income taxes.

Do you own a traditional Individual Retirement Account (IRA)?

<u>Speaking generally</u>, owners of traditional IRAs make contributions while working that are taxdeductible, and the assets in their accounts have the potential to grow tax-deferred. (Note: The tax rules for traditional IRAs are different than those for "Roth IRAs" and other types of retirement accounts.)



The assets in a traditional IRA account are subject to income tax when withdrawn. The tax law requires that owners begin to withdraw money from their traditional IRA accounts upon reaching a certain age. These mandatory withdrawals, which are called Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs), create taxable income.

If you are now required to withdraw RMDs from your traditional IRA, you may benefit from discussing with your tax advisor the potential for using Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) as a tax planning strategy. Your particular circumstances will need to be considered by both you and your tax advisor. After consulting your tax advisor, and if you decide to employ QCDs, they can be used to contribute to Cheshire Lutheran Church. (Note: CLC cannot provide tax advice.)

Its cobalt-blue waters are lined with magnificent mountains, lush gardens, and grand villas. Join the included boat trip to Bellagio, set in one of the most scenic position in all of Italy, and Varenna, an old fishing village. (B)

Day 6: (FRI) 31 JULY – Lake Como-Lugano, Switzerland-Lake Maggiore, Italy Depart Lake Como and cross the border into Switzerland. Day 8: (SUN) 2 AUGUST - Lake Maggiore Your vacation ends with breakfast this morning. Safe travels until we meet again! (B)



# **Bible Studies at CLC** WEEKLY BIBLE STUDIES...

Come and join us as we dig deeper into God's Word together in Bible Study.

Our Sunday morning Bible Study between the services starts at approximately 9:10 a.m. every Sunday. We began the study **The Bible on Trial: Beyond A Reasonable Doubt** during January and we'll be wrapping that up in the beginning of February. Once that is completed, we'll be moving on to a new topic. Join us on Sunday mornings as we dig deeper into God's Word together.

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
