### **Lenten Address**

P Brothers and sisters in Christ, Almighty God created us to live in communion with Him and with one another in love. Yet sin separates us from Him and each other, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended. By our sins, we also grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under His judgement, but to turn to Him and live.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we are called to struggle against all sin and temptation that would lead us away from loving God and our neighbor. Let us pray to our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son, and in the power of His Holy Spirit, that He would grant us grace to amend our lives, and that He would have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

- P Our anger at our own frustrations, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves,
- we confess to You, O Lord.
- Accept our repentance, Lord, for all the wrongs we have done. For looking to ourselves for our highest good, and not looking to Your Word and Your will,
- accept our repentance, Lord..

- P For our blindness to need and suffering in Your creation, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty in our world,
- accept our repentance, Lord..
- P For all false judgements, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward all who differ from us,
- accept our repentance, Lord..
- P Restore us, good Lord, and let Your anger depart from us.
- **C** Hear us, Lord, for the sake of Your Son. Amen.


<sup>1</sup>Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. <sup>2</sup>For he says,






